A WORD ABOUT OUR STAINED-GLASS WINDOWS



A number of our parishioners have asked why we've included repair of our stained-glass windows in our *Strong Roots, New Season* campaign.

On the one hand, the windows are core features of the building whose preservation ought to go hand-in-hand with our recent renovation. Many of these windows, however, are also **precious works of art** worth preserving in and of themselves. The **Dalle de Verre**, or 'slab glass' windows you see in the chapel, for instance, were created using a **painstaking method developed in 1930s Paris**, though relatively rare today, and feature strikingly deep colours in their mosaics. We are exceedingly fortunate to have these important **works of modernist art** in our building and to be able to share them once again when our doors open to the community.

Yet our stained-glass windows aren't just museum pieces. They also **embody our faith in tangible ways worth maintaining**. Their imagery can teach and draw us to wonder; **they commemorate our shared past and call us to carry forward its blessings**; their beauty illuminates and uplifts the soul. **To look upon them is to be reminded**

that God creates a world shot through with the "beauty of the infinite," a world in which our senses draw us to a deeper faith. Far from being incidental details of St. Aidan's, our stained glass forms a part of our historic identity whose value remains clear even to this day. Indeed, if we look closely, we may see the divine by the windows' light.
