

## **Campaign Update**

September 2024

Having reached a major milestone with the completion of the West Garden landscaping earlier this summer, we want to update you on the progress of all five campaign initiatives. Your pledges and contributions to the campaign made this work possible. We are grateful for your continued and generous support to care for our building and property as well as the spiritual formation of our congregation. #### **Masonry Repair & Restoration**

Estimate: \$300K	Actual: \$635K
Spent: \$275K	Status: Partial completion

Masonry on the south and west walls were completed in 2023 in preparation for landscaping the West Garden. Actual costs exceeded initial estimates due to inflation and critical repairs to the fascia, soffits, and flashings as well as waterproofing around the sub-basement.

**What's next:** Estimates received in 2023 for the north and east walls were \$120K and \$240K respectively. In order to proceed with work on these walls we will need to secure additional funds.

#### West Garden Landscaping

Estimate: \$100K	Actual: \$250K
Spent: \$200K	Status: In progress

In order to achieve our vision to make the garden a fully accessible gathering space for parishioners and community members, and because material and labor costs increased significantly since the initial estimate, we received approval from Vestry to increase the scope of this project to \$250,000. To close the funding gap, an additional \$100,000 was secured via grants and other donations and Vestry approved a \$50,000 withdrawal from the St. Aidan's Fund. Landscaping was completed in mid-June when parishioners planted more than 300 native plants throughout the garden.

What's next: Next steps include installing custom designed benches, signage, and more plants. We are inviting the entire Beach neighbourhood to celebrate the completed garden on Sunday, September 29, from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. Our area bishop, the Rt. Rev. Kevin Robertson, will join us to offer a special blessing.

#### **Stained Glass Conservation & Restoration**

Estimate: \$200K Spent: \$20K Status: Pending Vendor

Restoring our historic stained glass windows will be our next major project. To protect the windows in advance of remediation, the exterior frames were painted and several storm windows repaired. Over the next 10 years, 16 of 28 windows will require work to repair deformation and protect them from exposure to the elements. Windows requiring immediate attention will be prioritized, including the two windows on either side of the glass entrance, followed by one to two windows per year (which vendors have advised is the typical pace of work in this industry.)

What's next: Churchwarden Phil Aitkens will provide leadership for this project by securing and liaising with a glazier.

#### **Expanded Youth Ministry**

Estimate: \$50K Spent: \$18K Status: In Progress

Youth ministry continues to thrive since Elizabeth Achimah joined the St. Aidan's ministry team in September 2023. At peak, 25 youth participate in Sunday School and other activities including a bimonthly Dungeons and Dragons night, weekly Bible study and monthly socials. The youth are engaged and supportive of one another, showing up for their peers' major milestones including two youth baptisms and six youth confirmations.

What's next: A monthly basics of Christianity course to engage youth and their friends in continued spiritual formation.

#### **Associate Priest**

Estimate: \$100K Spent: \$0K Status: On Hold

This initiative was identified prior to a number of substantive changes within our parish community and has been put on hold for now. We may decide to re-allocate these funds towards one of the other initiatives.
